# Preparing the iPad

## Configuration of G/On Client

First time you use G/On on your iPad, it is set to use a demo server.

If you just want to try the demo server, please skip to page 14.

The following pages will instruct you on how to set up G/On to use your corporate server.

You only have to do this once.

Note: Configuration requires (besides the iPad):

- A computer with iTunes installed<sup>1</sup>
- A cable to connect the iPad to the computer
- A file from your IT administrator called gon\_connect\_info.dat

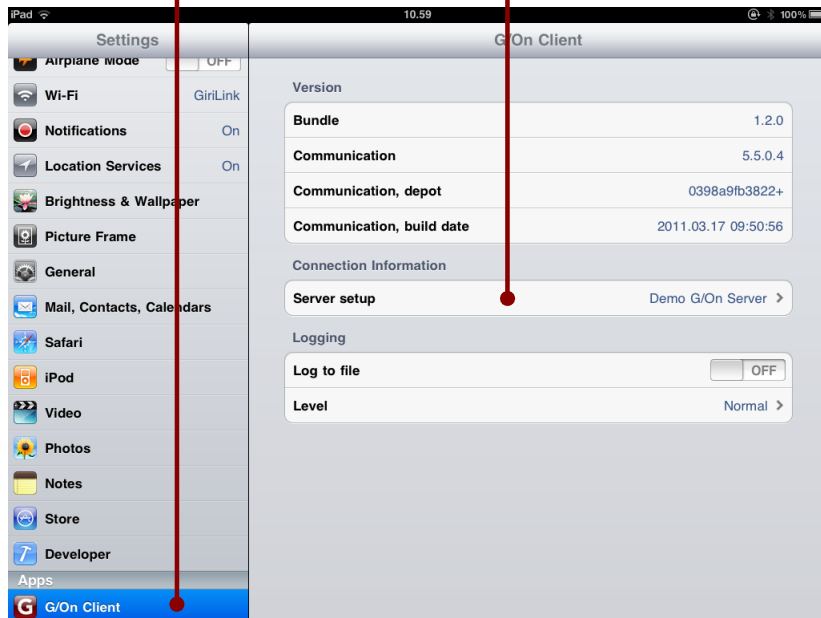

<sup>1</sup> The iPad has some system requirement to the computer and version of iTunes. As of march 2011, iPad requires Mac OS X 10.5.8 or later, Windows 7, Windows Vista or Windows XP (with Service Pack 3 or later). Further, iPad 1 requires iTunes 9.1 or later, and iPad 2 requires iTunes 10.1.2 (iTunes 10.2 or later recommended). If you have problems when connecting the iPad to the computer, please consult [www.apple.com](http://www.apple.com) for system requirements.

First you need to change from the demo server to your corporate server.

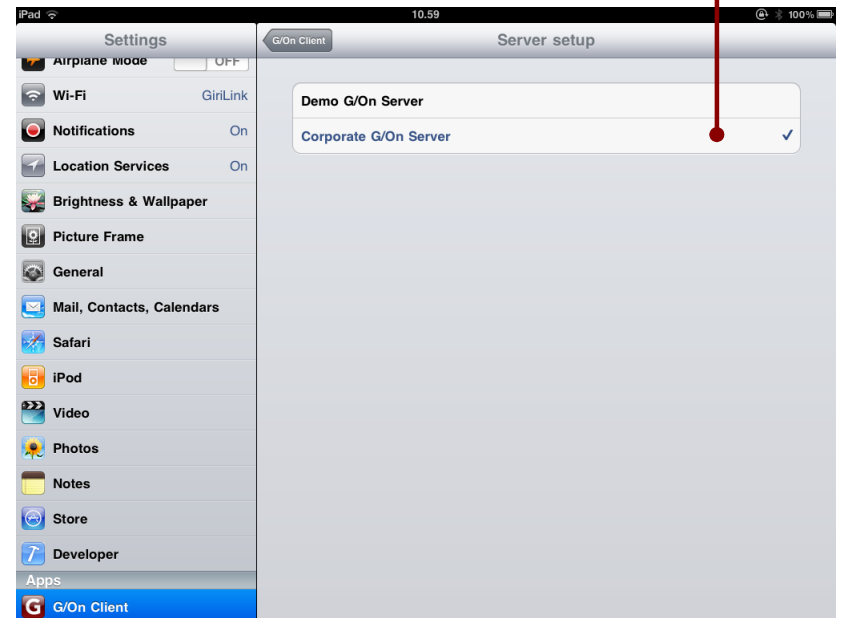
Open the Settings app.

Choose G/On Client. Tap Server setup.



Tap Corporate G/On Server.

Click the Home button  to exit setup.



Next you need to make sure that G/On is not already running.

Double-click the Home button

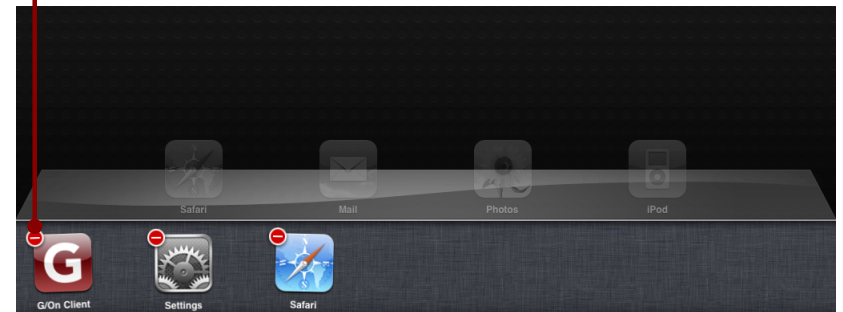


Check to see if there is a G/On Client icon in the list (Note: If you have more open apps than can be seen on one screen, you might need to flick from right to left to see all open apps.)



If there is no G/On Client icon, just click the Home button  and proceed to the next page.

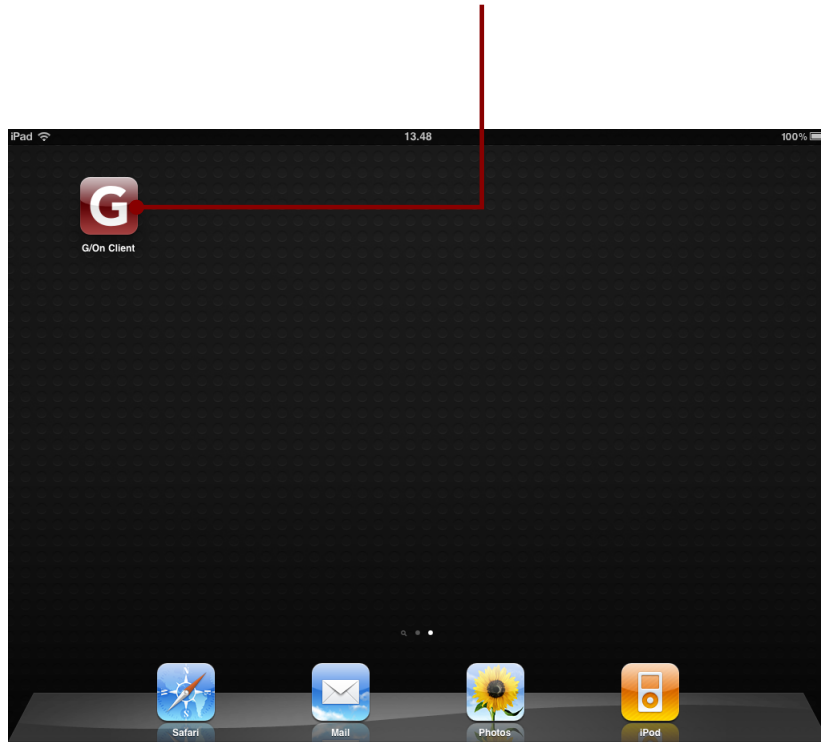
If there is a G/On Client icon, touch and hold the icon until it begins to jiggle, then tap the red minus.



Then double-click the Home button

Plug the iPad in to a computer with iTunes installed.

On the iPad: Open the G/On Client app.

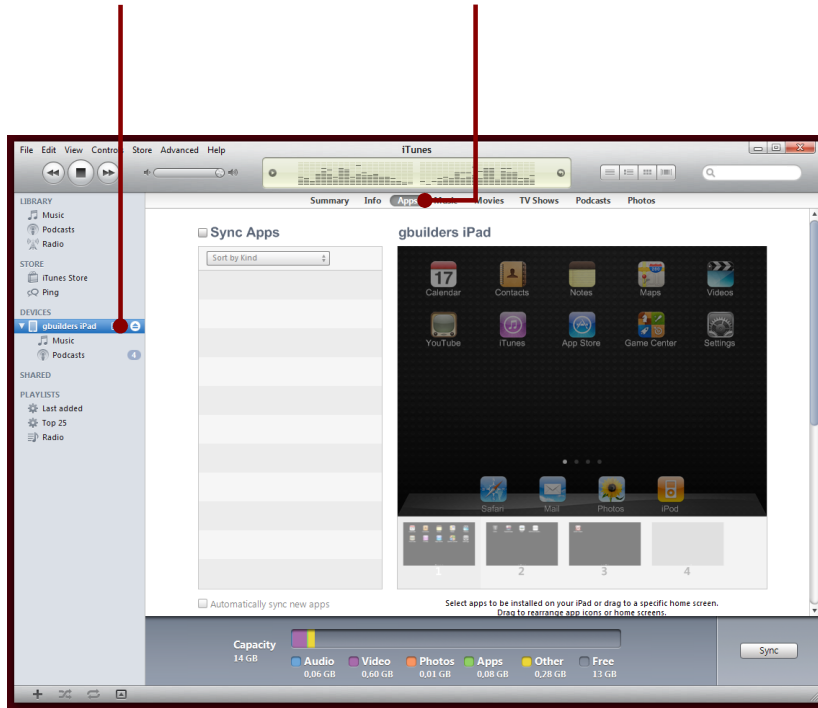


Tap Start Configuration.

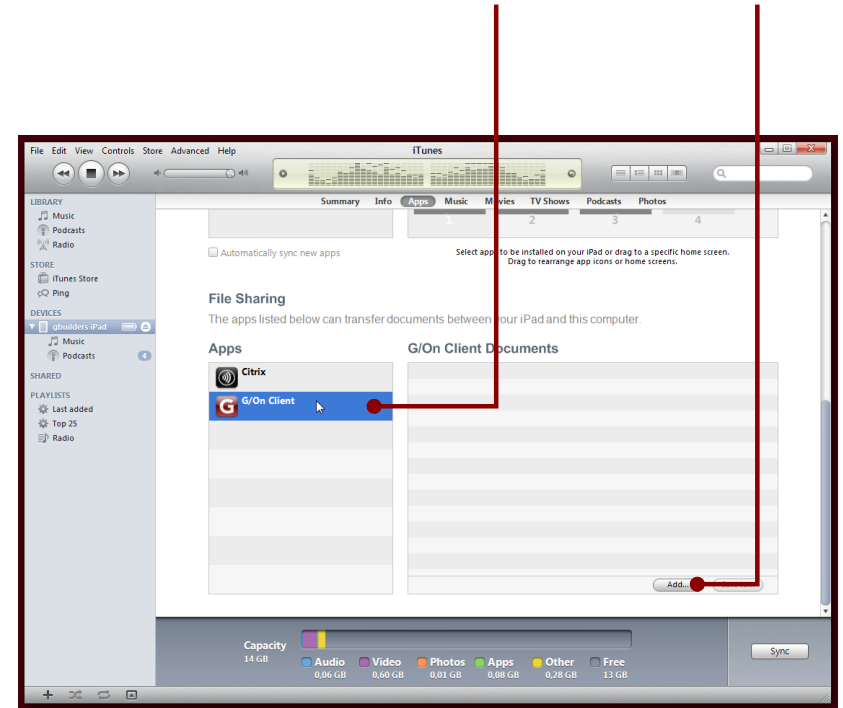


On the computer: Open iTunes if it did not open automatically.

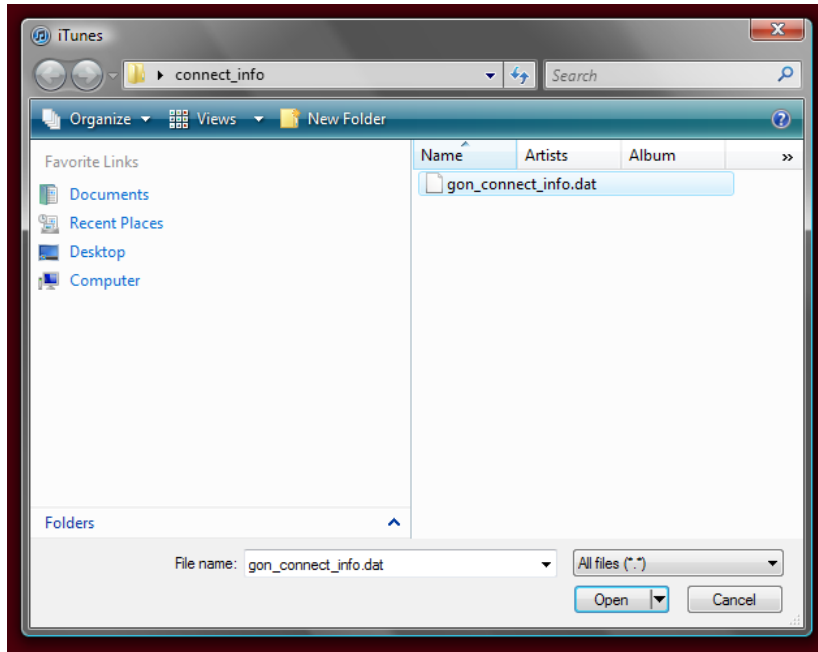
Click the iPad. Then click Apps.



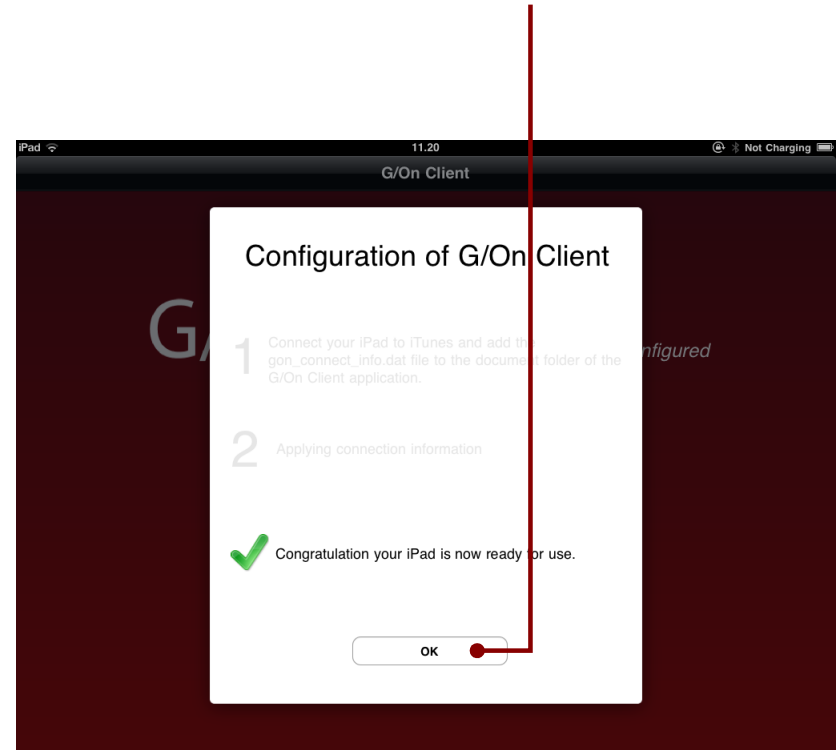
Scroll down and select G/On Client. Click Add...



Browse and find the file gon\_connect\_info.dat provided by your IT administrator, and open it.



On the iPad: When done, tap OK.

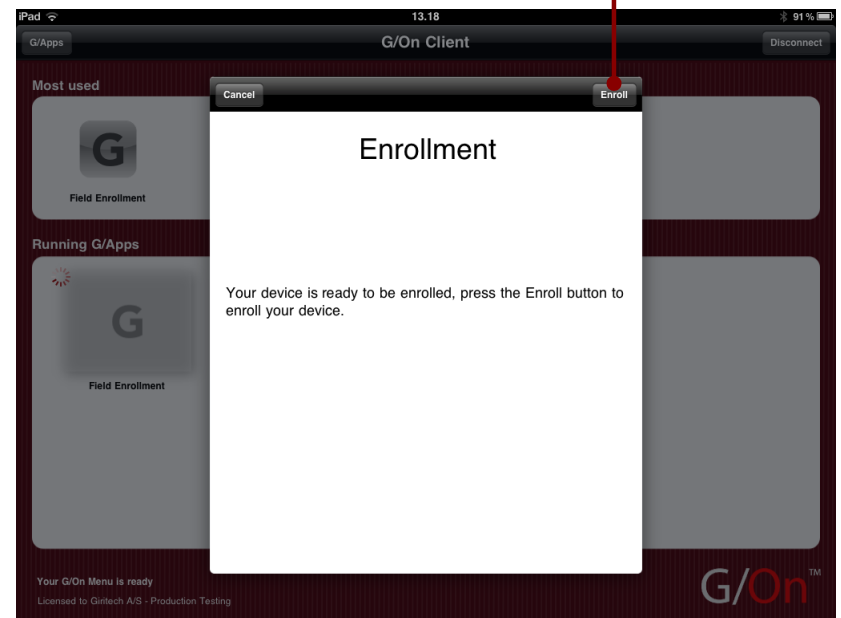


You can now disconnect the iPad from the computer.

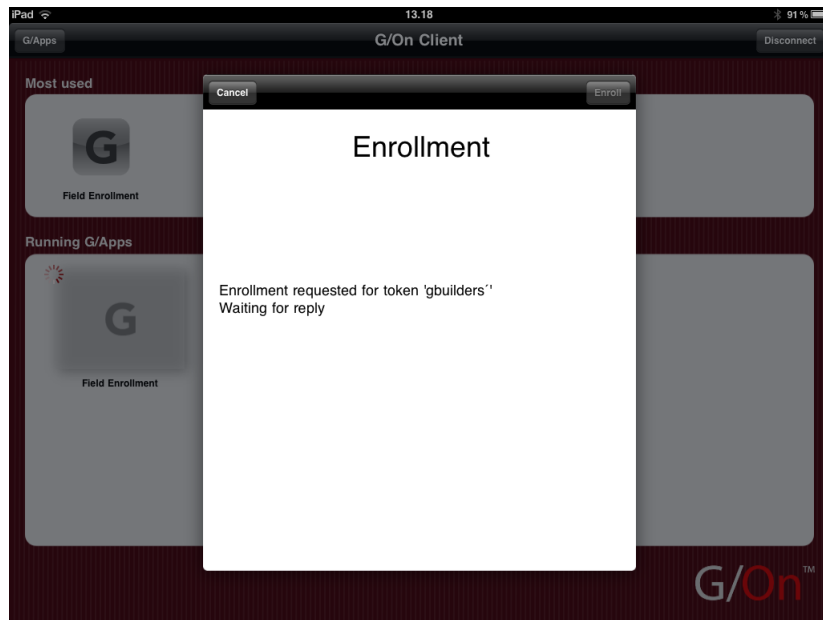
When G/On is ready to connect, tap Connect in the top right corner.



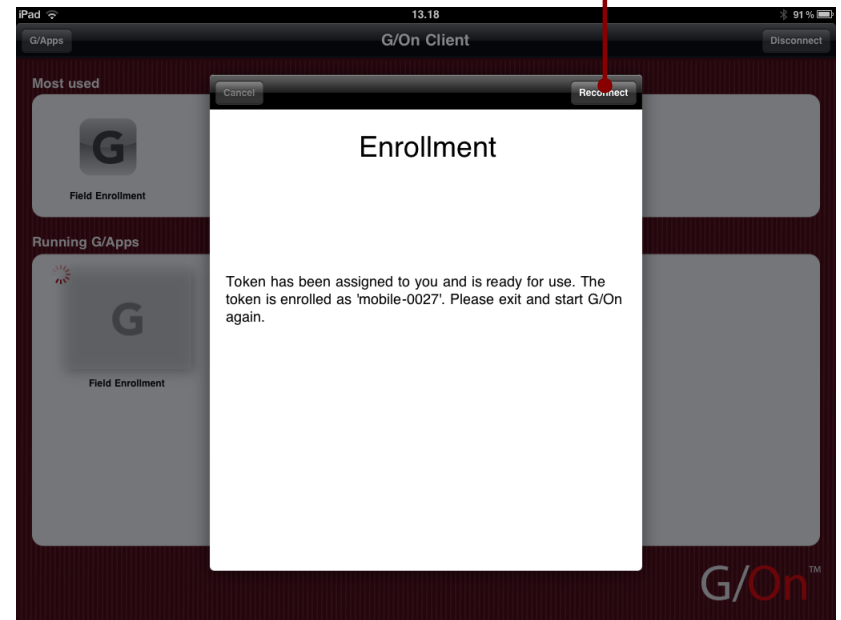
Now you need to enroll your iPad into the G/On system. Tap Enroll.



Wait while your iPad is enrolled.



When it is done, tap Reconnect.



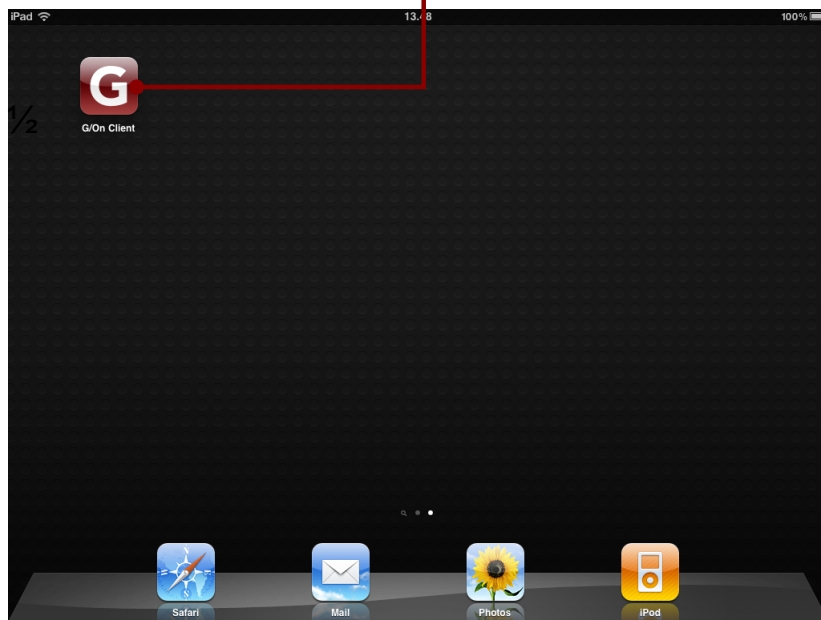
Your iPad is now ready for use with G/On.

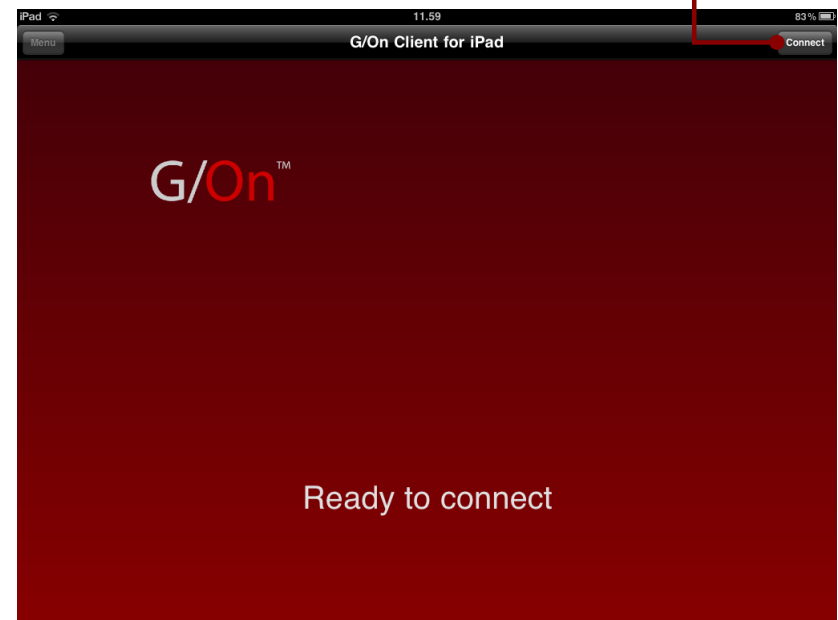
# Using the iPad

# 1 Connect

To open G/On, tap G/On Client.



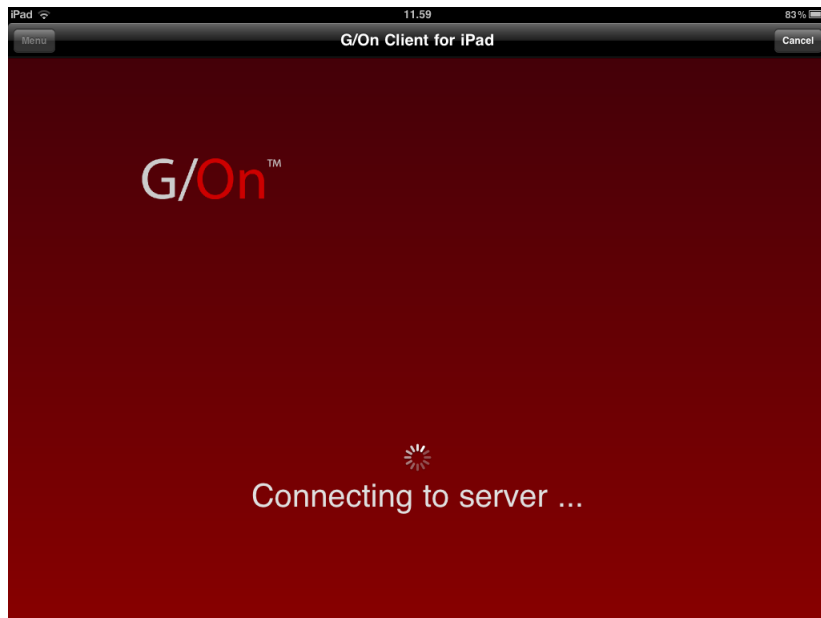
When G/On is ready to connect, tap Connect in the top right corner.



**Note:** If this is the first time you start G/On on your iPad, please see the previous pages on how to configure G/On.

## 2 Log in

Wait while the iPad connects to the server.



Enter your Username and Password. Tap OK.



### 3 Work

#### G/Apps

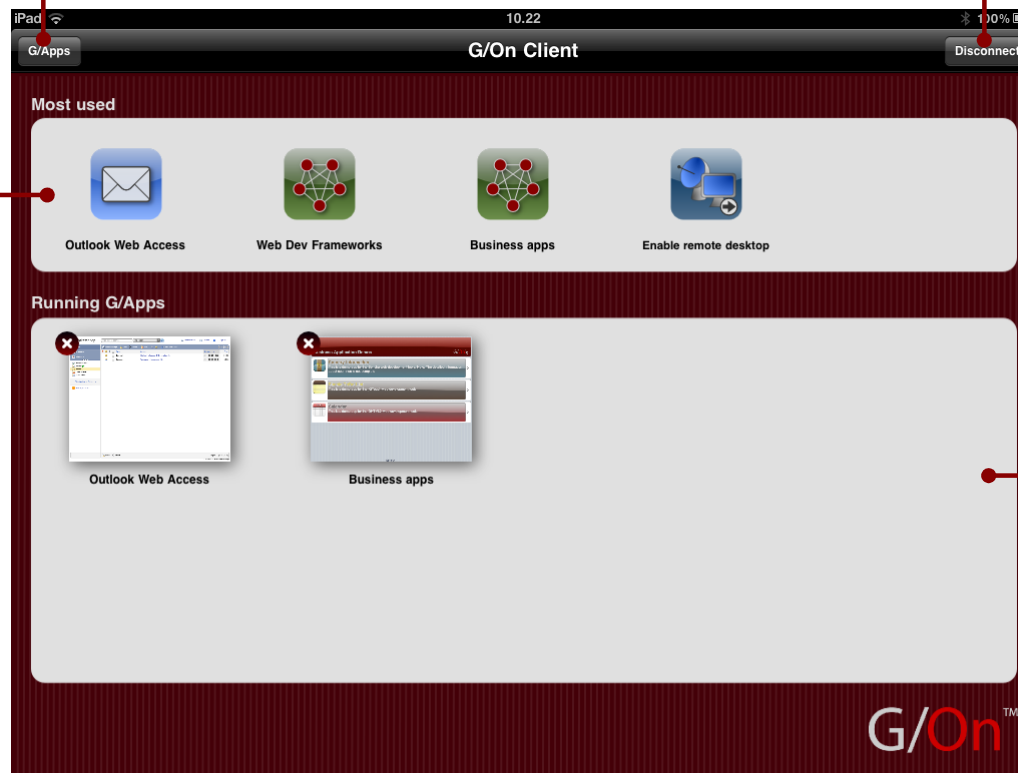
A menu containing all the available apps.

#### Most used

The most used apps for quick access.

#### Disconnect

Button to disconnect (or reconnect to) the server.

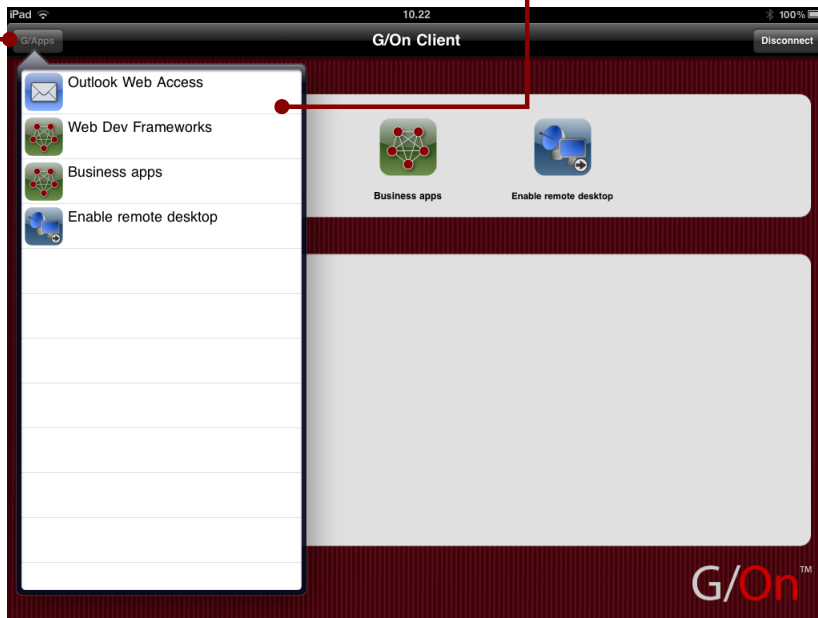


#### Running G/Apps

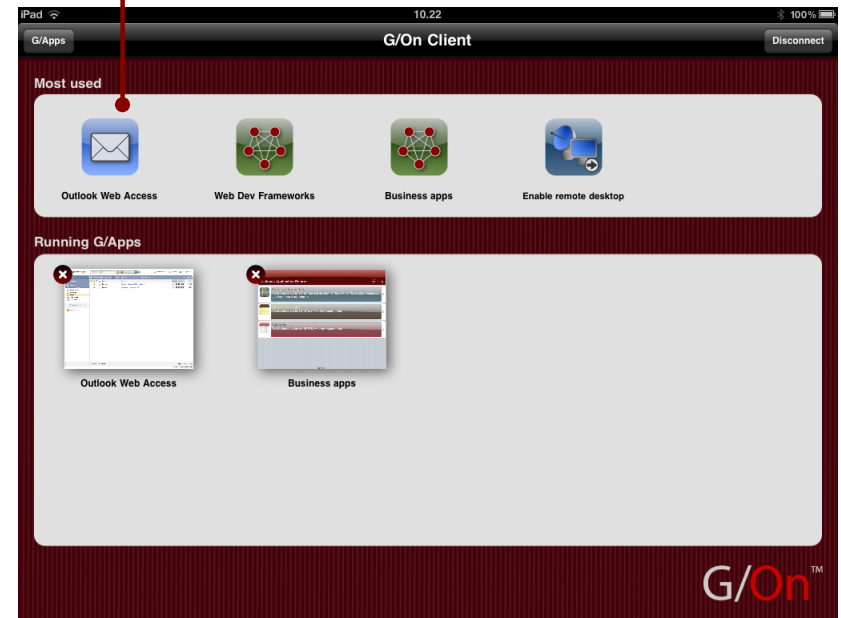
Overview of running apps. Access or close apps here.

## Open apps

Tap G/Apps to see a menu containing all the apps you have access to. Tap the app you want to start.



For quick access, you can just tap an app in Most used.



## App window

### Back

Move back in browsing history.

### Forward

Move forward in browsing history.

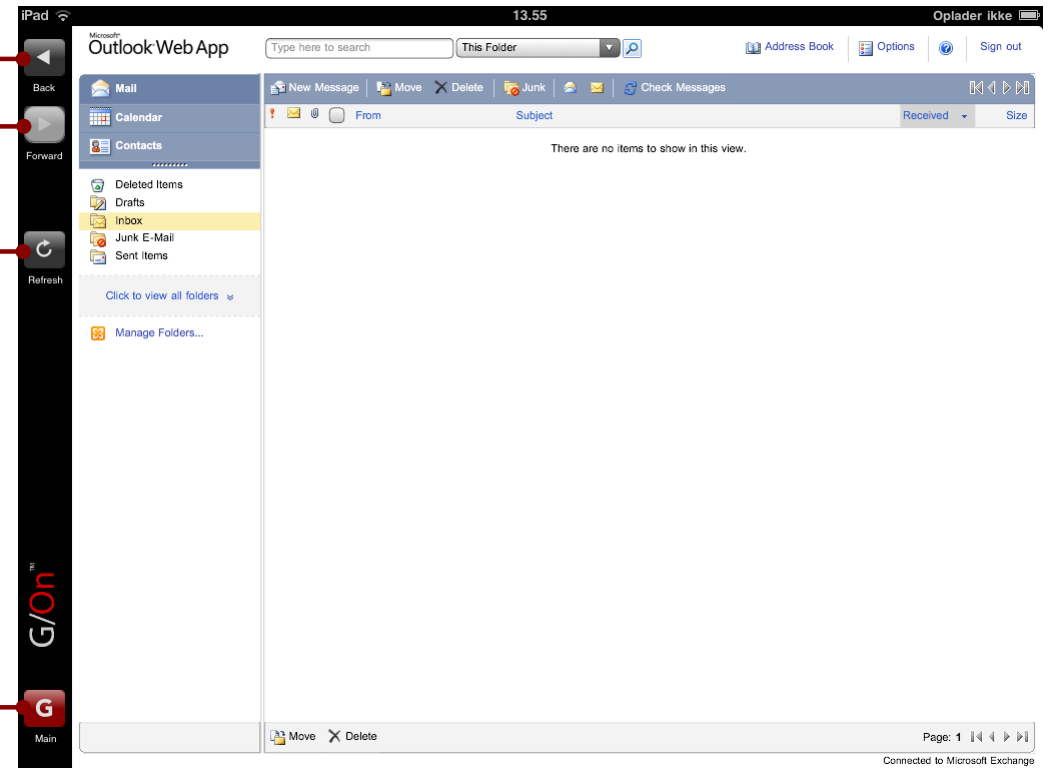
### Refresh

Reloads the page.

### Main

Brings you back to the main view, where you can open other apps.

Note: This does not close the current app.



## Running G/Apps

### Switch to app

Tap to return to the app.

### Close

Tap the X to close the app.



## 4 Done

If you click the Home button  G/On will remember your login. This allows G/On to start again without prompting for Username and Password.

**Note:** See next page for more information!



If you want to log out completely, tap Disconnect before clicking the Home button



After moving the G/On iOS client to the background, it will continue to run for approximately 10 minutes.

- The maximum of 10 minutes is imposed by Apple iOS, in order to improve battery performance. It also gives improved security
- If the user does not bring the G/On client to the foreground before the 10 min limit, the G/On client will disconnect from the server.
- If the G/On client has disconnected due to such a time out, it will automatically re-login with the same Username and Password, when it is later moved to the foreground (provided that it has not been inactive beyond a certain timeout specified on the server). However, since it is a new login, the menu actions will have to be started manually, again.
